“MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2018-24

AN ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING THE “SAN NICOLAS HEALING TIME” AS ANTI-DRUG ABUSE AND COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION PROGRAM OF SAN NICOLAS, ILOCOS NORTE, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Section 16 of RA 710, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that Local Government Units shall pursue undertakings to improve public morals and maintain peace and order among other equally significant concerns;

WHEREAS, as mandated by RA 9165, otherwise known as the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002, the state shall protect its people from any harm and its effects brought about by illegal drugs and shall provide for the support and unrelenting campaign against illegal use of drugs and trafficking through effective enforcement of anti-drug policies, programs and projects;

WHEREAS, the development and well-being of all the sectors especially the youth is a priority of the municipal government in terms of the protection of rights, promotion of general welfare as well as community development;

WHEREAS, the municipal government engages its stakeholders in the advocacy and implementation of various programs and activities against illegal drugs in the barangays in consonance with national flagship advocacies;

WHEREAS, the municipal government aligned its *Healing Time* consistent with requisites of Dangerous Drug Board Resolutions and the Mamamayan Ayaw sa Anomalya, Mamamayan Ayaw sa Illegal na Droga (MASAMASID) Program of the national government which aims to provide responsive strategies and holistic approaches towards the reformation and rehabilitation of victims of illegal drugs;

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan assembled in session that:

ARTICLE I

TITLE, POLICY, PRINCIPLES AND DEFINITION OF TERMS

SECTION 1. Title. This enactment shall be otherwise known as the San Nicolas “**Healing Time Ordinance**” of the Municipal Government of San Nicolas, Ilocos Norte.

SECTION 2. Policy. the municipal government aligns its thrusts in safeguarding the integrity of its area of jurisdiction and the well-being of its citizenry particularly the youth, from harmful effects of dangerous drugs on their physical and mental well-being, and to defend the same against acts or omissions detrimental to their development and preservation.

Toward this end, the municipal government shall pursue an intensive and unrelenting campaign against the trafficking and use of dangerous drugs and other similar substances through an integrated system of planning, implementation and enforcement of anti-drug abuse policies, programs and projects.

SECTION 3. Guiding Principles.

The municipal government needs to enhance its initiatives generally to save lives and future of those persons who have once used drugs and voluntary surrendered with the authorities of the government. Significant to the initiatives is the willingness of the PWUD to be reformed and rehabilitated under “Healing Time” of the municipal government.

Enshrined in the Administration’s 9-Point Agenda are Peace and Order and Moral Recovery which remain as great challenge necessary in the achievement of the vision of the municipality.

Vision:

“Ti San Nicolas ket masirmata a maysa a natalinaay ken nadur-as a komunidad ti agrikultura ken industria ket iti pannakaragpat dagitoy, kabayabayna ti pannakasaluad ken pannakatagiben ti aglawlaw ken nakaparsuaan”.

9-Point Agenda

1. Effective and efficient governance
2. Environmental rehabilitation
3. Economic development
4. Heritage and Cultural Development
5. Health and Sanitation
6. Peace and Order
7. Tourism
8. Education
9. Moral and Spiritual Enhancement

SECTION 4. Definition of Terms and Accronyms.

- a.) **Community Based Rehabilitation Program (CBRP)** – consists of projects and activities designed to motivate drug surrenderees to change their behavior;
- b.) **San Nicolas Healing Time** – a localized Community-Based Rehabilitation Program (CBRP) engaging various sectors of the community aims to reform and rehabilitate PWUDs in consonance with the Mamamayan Ayaw sa Anomalya, Mamamayan Ayaw sa Illegal na Droga (MASAMASID) Program and requirements of various Dangerous Drug Board Resolutions;
- c.) **MASAMASID Program** – stands for Mamamayan Ayaw sa Anomalya, Mamamayan Ayaw sa Illegal na Droga Program introduced by the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) which aims to establish a mechanism advocacy program against illegal drugs and designed to enjoin local government units to implement a community based rehabilitation program in their area of responsibility engaging various sectors of the society with the local governments;
- d.) **PWUD** – stands for Person Who Used Illegal Drugs and refers to any person who have experienced or used illegal drugs categorized into mild, moderate or severe degree illegal drug user or dependent;

- e.) *Drug Surrendered* –refers to the name designated for a person who is a PWUD or illegal drug personality under the monitoring and qualification of the MADAC and PNP, surrendered voluntarily with the government through the Municipal Mayor, PNP, BADAC and other concerned authorities;
- f.) *M/BADAC* – stand for Municipal or Barangay Anti-Drug Abuse Council duly organized as an advisory councils on concerns relating to illegal drugs and responsible in the formulation of plans, advocacy and implementation of programs, projects and activities against illegal drugs in the communities;
- g.) *Alcohol, Smoking and Substance Involvement Screening Test (ASSIST)* – Developed by the World Health Organization (WHO), the screening tool is used to detect and manage substance use and related problems in primary health care and general medical care setting. The tool was translated to Filipino with consent from the WHO for use in the Philippine setting;
- h.) *Drugs Dependency* – refers to a state of psychological and/or physical dependence or drugs arising in a person following the administration or use of the drugs on a periodic and continuous basis;
- i.) *Social Support Systems include but not limited to the following activities.*
 - Technical Skills Enhancement;
 - Livelihood training activities;
 - Educational programs;
 - Civic and Environmental Awareness Activities;
 - Job Placement/Employment.
- j.) *Spiritual/Faith Based-Interventions* – The use of moral and spiritual principles, doctrines and writings to influence the well-being of a substance user and leverage potential venues for reinforcing healthy behaviors;
- k.) *Treatment* – is the medical service rendered to a drug dependent for the effective management of his physical and mental conditions arising from the drug abuse;

ARTICLE II.

COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION PROGRAM FOR PWUDS AND ILLEGAL DRUG SURRENDERERS

SECTION 5. Institutionalization of the San Nicolas Healing Time. – the municipal government shall institutionalize the implementation of its Community Based Rehabilitation Program (CBRP0 known as “Healing Time” to provide a holistic and comprehensive approach of reforming the victims of illegal drugs and indirectly strengthening the pillars of the criminal justice system especially the vital role of institutions and the community in the reintegration of the victims to the community;

SECTION 6. Objectives of Healing Time. The program aims the following:

1. Intensify strict implementation of RA 9165 and other related laws and ordinances;
2. Establish a classified data base of drug personalities which is highly confidential;
3. Prescribe protocols in the voluntary surrendering of drug personalities;
4. Reform and rehabilitate PWUDs or drug surrenderers engaging various sectors of the society and other stakeholders under the CBRP;
5. Establish and innovates practices on comprehensive community based rehabilitation program for PWUDs or drug surrenderers.

The “San Nicolas Healing Time” project shall embrace responsive reformation a activities and other relative activities and other relative advocacy which shall structurally and methodically define the features of such CBRP. Its implementation shall be spearheaded by the Executive Department in coordination with the PNP and concerned agencies of the national government.

The initial stage of the project shall include implementing RA 9165 such as but not limited to apprehension by the PNP, PDEA and BADACs to illegal drugs suspects. Also as component, activities under rehabilitation, moral recovery, reformation of drug personalities shall be the major strengths of the project.

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Institutional Partners of the municipal government shall include but not limited to the following:

1. Philippine National Police;
2. Mariano Marcos Memorial Hospital and Medical Center;
3. GOESAN Multi-Purpose Cooperative;
4. Religious and Interfaith Organizations;
 - a. Roman Catholic Church;
 - b. Assemblies of God Church;
 - c. Level Up Ministries Incorporation;
5. Venvi Groups of Incorporations;
6. Globe Telecom;
7. Other interested corporations and juridical entities.

SECTION 8. Methodology and Strategies. To sustain the effectiveness of the program of the municipal government shall adopt the following initiatives and measures.

SECTION 8.1 Strict Implementation of Laws – the PNP in coordination with PDEA and other lined agencies, the MADAC and BADACs shall spearhead the implementation of RA 9165 particularly on the conduct of police operations in the barangays. Meetings of the MPOC, MADAC and BADACs shall be likewise institutionalized.

Illegal Drug Personalities who voluntarily surrendered themselves to the PNP shall undergo Tactical Interrogation by the personnel of the PNP. After the process, those included in the final list shall be presented to the Local Chief Executive for the application of the Diversion Program to the recipient-victims;

SECTION 8.2 San Nicolas Healing Time Approach – the program shall embrace responsive reformation activities and other relative advocacy for the victims of illegal drugs in the municipality;

SECTION 8.2.1 Preliminaries – an orientation for the purpose shall be conducted to introduce the features of the “Healing Time”.

Screening and Assessment Procedures for PWUDs or Illegal Drug Surrendered shall be in accordance with Section 3, Article 1 of the Dangerous Drug Board Resolution (DDB) No. 4;

- a.) The whole process of voluntary surrender to the authorities shall be properly documented by the PNP, DSWDO or Duty Officer of the MADAC and covered by video recording, if possible. The MADAC shall consequently provide the names and offices of Duty Officers which shall be forwarded to the DDB and DILG for records purposes;
- b.) An interview shall be conducted by personnel of the MSWDO who will solicit personal information from the surrenderer Names, addresses, contact numbers, religious affiliation and sex will be recorded for purposes of monitoring compliance to prescribed program if necessary and record the information in the record book;

The Conduct of interview by the personnel of the MSWDO shall also for purposes of determining personal information relative to their social status and activities, extent of illegal drug dependency and other relevant information which are necessary relative to the provision of livelihood opportunities and for policy and planning requirements;

- c.) The MADAC shall verify with law enforcement agencies such as but not limited to the Philippine National Police, Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency or National Bureau of Investigation if the surrendere is included in the Target List, Wanted List and Wanted List Personalities or if he/she has any other pending criminal case/s;
- d.) If it is verified that the surrenderer has a pending warrant of arrest or criminal case, he/she shall be referred to the Office of the Prosecutor or the Court, Voluntary surrender may be considered as a mitigating circumstance depending on the facts of the case.

If the name of the surrenderer is listed in any of the aforesaid lists but he has no pending case, he shall be referred to the law enforcement agency who has included said surrendere in its list for proper investigation.

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Surrenderers who wish to be part of the Witness Protection Program (“WPP”) should be able to provide verifiable information. Inclusion in the WPP is subject to the evaluation of the Philippine National Police and WPP’s set of evaluators.

- e.) The surrenderer shall made to sign a “KARI” Pledge of Commitment or AFFIDAVIT OF UNDERTAKING and WAIVER mandating the conduct of an assessment (drug dependency examination), physical /medical examination and drug test. It shall also provide that he shall reform himself/herself and will no longer participate in any illegal drug activity.

A family member who is of age majority, preferably a parent or a spouse, shall also sign said Affidavit Consent of the parents or guardian shall be obtained for surrenderers who are minors.

- f.) A screening of the surrenderer shall be undertaken by capacitated personnel from ADAC’s or Municipal or City Health Office personnel in order to determine the category or degree of dependency of the PWUD. The screening shall be undertaken using “The Alcohol, Smoking and Substance Involvement Screening Test (ASSIST) through an interview and/or the provision of the questionnaire. Other internationally accepted screening tools may also be used.

Section 8.2.2. Project Activities/Intervention to be Undertaken- Generally, the degree of dependency of the PWUD as to be determined in the assessment shall suggest the kind of intervention appropriate for rehabilitation;

If found to be “Low” risk, the MADAC may provide or refer the PWUD or surrenderer to but not limited to one or more of the following interventions.

1. Motivational interviews
2. Brief Interventions
3. Spiritual/Faith-Based Interventions
4. Social Support Activities
 - a. Technical Skill Enhancement
 - b. Livelihood training activities
 - c. Educational Programs
 - d. Civic and Environment Awareness Activities
 - e. Job Placement/Employment
5. Other activities deemed necessary

If found to be of “Moderate or High” risk, the PWUD will be referred or endorsed to the Regional Office of the Department of Health for further assessment.

Constructive motivational activities may be likewise undertaken to help the PWUDs recover from the traumatic experience with illegal drugs and to reform themselves to become more productive citizens such as but not limited to the following:

- a. **Grooming-** the victims shall avail the “Libreng Gupit” and seminars on proper hygiene aiming improve their personal appearance, disposition and confidence.
- b. **Stress Management** – in coordination with the Mariano Marcos Memorial Hospital and Medical Center, the victims shall undergo stress management seminar to overcome stress and pressures caused by their failures, insecurities, workplace or social environment in general;
- c. **Conduct of Psychological and Psychiatric Examination/Counseling-** in coordination with Mariano Marcos Memorial Hospital and Medical Center and other partner institutions and agencies, the victims shall undergo Psychological and Psychiatric examination with the support of their family members. Counseling by medical and psychiatric experts shall ensure tender loving care and understanding by the members of their family in the process or stages of withdrawals by the victims;
- d. **Conduct of Periodic Drug Testing-** in coordination with Mariano Marcos Memorial Hospital and Medical Center and other partner institutions and agencies, the victims shall undergo a periodic random drug testing to check whether or not a victim or dependent from illegal drugs has again used illegal drugs while undergoing the diversion program. Schedule of testing subject to its availability and applicability shall be determined by the technical working group;



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- e. **Participation to Moral Recovery and Religious Activities-** victims shall attend the scheduled mass to be administered by the church and other interfaith Organizations operating within the municipality. House to house visitation by church leaders shall also be conducted;
- f. **Livelihood Opportunities/Job Placement-** in coordination with partner organization such as Venvi Group of Companies and Globe Telecom, the victims shall be endorsed subject to assessment and qualification by the LGU and concerned partner organization or agency;
- g. **Skills Training** – Applicable training programs shall be implemented for the victims-recipient to improve their knowledge and skills for the possible employment. The MSWDO, MPDC and MOA shall spearhead the identification of applicable skills training;
- h. **Financial Assistance or Capital Assistance** – victim recipient can avail the seed capital assistance program of the LGU to start their own business or any feasible economic activities. The provision shall be spearheaded by the MSWDO and Office of the Mayor.
- i. **Provision for Cash for Work Program-** Under the MSWDO, the municipal government shall allocate funds for the provision of cash for work program to those interested and qualified victim-recipient. Generally, aside from its social benefits, all the victims shall undergo the activities under this program to financially support their families.
- j. **Home Visitation** – aside from the visitations of the religious and interfaith organization leaders, the municipal government through its pro-active organizations such as the 4H Club and Senior Citizens shall conduct house to house visitation to the victims and their families. The purpose of the activity is to provide counseling and monitoring of the whereabouts of the victims;
- k. **Zumba-** The municipal government shall institute Zumba exercises for the victims to maintain or improve in physical attributes. Schedule shall be determined by the Technical Working Group.
- l. **Civic Works and Greening Activities-** The municipal government shall engage the victims to the greening and other civic activities such as tree planting, de clogging and cleaning of canals and other related activities.
- m. **Participation to other related and relevant activities** such as but not limited to sports engagement, and other activities within the context of the diversion program of the municipal government,
- n. **Diversion Program for Minors** – Children and minors who are vulnerable and victims of illegal drugs be exclusively and confidentially catered by the MSWDO with their regular Diversion Program in handling cases of minors in conflict with the law. The municipal government shall initiate holistic programs for minors and their parents to counter and overcome the traumatic experiences and results of their involvement on illegal drugs.

SECTION 8.3. Monitoring and Evaluation- the following activities shall undertaken

- 1. **Regular Monitoring and Reporting by the MADAC and BADAC-** The Barangay Anti Drug Abuse Council shall monitor the observable contrary activities or whereabouts of the victims of illegal drugs in their respective barangays. A regular monitoring report shall be submitted to the Municipal Anti Drug Abuse Council through the PNP Chief of Police.

Inter agency municipal and barangay coordination shall be established between and among those involved authorities in the monitoring of the victims or personalities of illegal drugs.

- 2. **Results of the Periodic Drug Testing-** the results of the testing shall be a basis for the LGU to consider whether he or she was sincere and fulfilled with his or her oath of undertaking or the “Kari” pledge,
- 3. **Hotline-** a reporting or feedback mechanism to be maintained by the PNP shall be established through a Hotline Number where residents can report drug related incidents and other concerns on illegal drugs.

SECTION 8.4. Creation of “Healing Time”- MASAMASID Municipal Ordinance Oversight Committee and Technical Working Group (TWG), with its duties and functions. There is hereby created Municipal Oversight Committee and Technical Working Group (TWG) of the Municipality of San Nicolas, Ilocos Norte with the following composition and functions;

SECTION 8.4.1 Composition- the “Healing Time”- MASAMASID Oversight Committee and Technical Working Group (TWG) shall be composed of the following:

- I. OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE:
 - Chairman: Municipal Mayor; MPOC Chairman
 - Co Chairman: Municipal Vice Mayor
 - Members: “Healing Time” Focal Person/LDRRMO
 - LnB President
 - Mun. Administrator
 - MSWDO
 - MLGOO

- II. TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP
 - Chairman: “Healing Time” Focal Person/LDRRMO
 - Members: PNP-COP
 - Mun. Administrator
 - MHO
 - MSWDO
 - LnB President
 - SB Secretary
 - Mun. Budget Officer
 - DepEd Representative
 - Representative of Parish Pastoral Church
 - Religious/Interfaith Groups Representative
 - Representative from Legal Profession
 - Medical Society Representative
 - Others

SECTION 8.4.2 Functions, Duties and Responsibilities of the “Healing Time”- MASAMASID Municipal Ordinance Oversight Committee and Technical Working Group (TWG).-The following duties and functions shall be observed:

- a. *Oversight Committee:*
 1. Formulate plans, policies and recommend measures to the Sangguniang Bayan on advocacy and institutionalization of programs, projects and activities relative to the campaign against illegal drugs;
 2. Order and periodically convene the Mun. Technical Working group to discuss and concerns on the implementation of the Healing Time Program and its related activities;
 3. Oversee the effective implementation of the Healing Time Program and its related activities.

- b. *The Technical Working Group*
 1. Coordinate the conduct information and education campaigns;
 2. Organize forums, seminars and related activities on prevention and demand reduction;
 3. Coordinate with schools for possible partnership on information drive against illegal drugs;
 4. Coordinate with local organizations whose primary mission is to fight illegal drug and illegal drug activities, and
 5. Encourage the support of interfaith leaders to incorporate anti-illegal drug advocacy in their service;
 6. Encourage the support of the community in gathering and reporting information on any incident related to illegal drug activities; and
 7. Institute reporting mechanism in consultation with the local PNP and church/or faith-based organizations;
 8. Monitor the progress of the Recovering Drug Dependents (RDDs)
 9. Work with the network of local volunteers on the implementation of interventions for community-based rehabilitation programs; and
 10. Assist in the integration of the recovering drug dependents.



SECTION 8.5. Coordination and Institutional Linkages- Parallel to the initiatives and advocacy efforts of the MADAC is the relentless support and coordination vis-a-viz by the Barangay Anti Drug Abuse Councils created in every barangay of the municipality.

SECTION 8.5.1. MADAC Composition- There shall be created MADAC in the municipality with the following composition.

- Chairman Municipal Mayor
- Vice Chairman: Chief of Police, SN-MPS
- Members: SB Member, Committee on Peace and Order
- Liga ng mga Barangay President
- MSWDO
- Municipal Health Officer
- Municipal LGOO
- Municipal Trial Court Judge
- Municipal Public Information Officer
- At least 2 representatives of NGOs
- Religious Sector Representative
- SK Federation Chairman

SECTION 8.5.2. Functions, Duties and Responsibilities of the MADAC- the following duties and functions shall be observed:

1. To formulate plans and programs for the eradication of abuse of drugs by the youth;
2. To conduct educational campaign among parents and youth about the ills of drug abuse;
3. To serve as forum for the ventilation of ideas on drug abuse prevention and control;
4. To plan rehabilitation of the victims of abuse of drugs; and
5. To discharge such other functions as it deem necessary.

SECTION 8.5.3. BADAC Composition- There is hereby created BADAC in the barangay which shall serve as an advisory council in the advocacy, formulation and implementation of anti drug abuse plans with the following composition.

- Chairman Punong Barangay
- Vice Chairman: Brgy. Kag., Comm. on Peace and Order
- Members: Barangay Kagawad (Chair of Women and Family)
- Liga ng mga Barangay President
- SK Chairperson
- Public/Private School Principal or representative
- Executive Officer/Chief Tanod
- At least two (2) representatives of NGOs/Civic Society
- Representatives of Faith-Based Organization

SECTION 8.5.4. Functions, Duties and Responsibilities of the BADAC - the following duties and functions shall be observed:

1. Plan, strategize, implement and evaluate programs and projects on drug abuse prevention in the Barangay;
2. Coordinate and collaborate with other institutions implementing programs and projects on drug abuse at the barangay level;
3. Continuously gather and update data on drug abuse and its effect on the peace and order situation in the barangay including listing of drug users and pushers;
4. Submit a monthly report to the Municipal Anti-Drug Abuse Council through the DILG Municipal Field Office.
5. Refer users and pushers to the police and other institutions for corresponding sanctions, rehabilitation and/or counseling.
6. Perform such other functions which may be assigned by the higher level Anti-Drug Abuse Councils.

SECTION 8.5.5. Establishment of Barangay Rehabilitation Referral Desks- There shall be established Barangay Rehabilitation Referral Desk with a Duty Officer (DO) appointed by the Punong Barangay in every barangay. The DO shall perform the following roles and responsibilities:

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1. Man the Rehabilitation Referral Desk;
2. Conduct an interview to solicit personal information from the surrenderer using the Form "Annex B" of MC 2017-151;
3. Immediately inform the Punong Barangay in case the surrenderer is included in the Target List, Wanted List and Watch List Personalities of Law Enforcement agencies, such as but not limited to PDEA, PNP, and NBI or has any other pending crimmlinal case;
4. Refer of endorse drug dependents to the Mun. Anti-Drug Abuse Council (MADAC) for screening using the Alcohol, Smoking and Substance Involvement Screening Test (ASSIST);
5. Log and maintain record book containing all personal information of surrenderers;
6. Ensure confidentiality of all information of surrenderers,
7. Monitor progress of surrenderers, and
8. Perform other duties and functions as maybe deemed necessary.

ARTICLE III

AFTERCARE PROGRAM, PROVISION OF SOCIAL SUPPORT SYSTEMS TO PWUDS AND ILLEGAL DRUG SURRENDEREDS

SECTION 8.6. Partnership and Collaboration- the LGU-San Nicolas referred therto as first party shall be responsible in identifying and out-sourcing of potential livelihood opportunities to be provided to victims/surrenderrees of illegal drugs in the municipality and proper linkage coordination with partner institutions referred thereto as Second Party on the employment of the victim/surrenderrees;

SECTION 8.6.1. Procedures- the "Healing Time" Technical Working Group (TWG) on Livelihood Programs spearheaded by the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Officer (MSWDO) shall cause the profiling of all the victims/surenderrees and the categorical initial screening and selection of potential qualified victim-applicant or victim-applicants for livelihood or employment purposes subject to final screening and selection by the partner institutions relating and without prejudice to their recruitment and technical qualifications of the job offerings;

The Technical Working Group Livelihood Programs shall be composed of the following:

- Chairman: MSWDO
- Member: PNP
- Municipal Administrator
- GAD Focal Person
- MHO
- Human Resource Officer
- Liga ng Barangay President

The PNP Chief of Police and the Punong Barangay shall likewise recommend measures to the TWG on the basis of their monitoring and evaluation relating to the progress of rehabilitation of the victims/surrenderrees:

Only those victim/surrenderrees who passed the screening and selection process by the TWG shall be recommended for endorsement by the Municipal Mayor to the concerned partner institutions according to parameters such as but not limited to the following:

- a. Behavioral Conditions;
- b. Educational attainment and Technical Capacity or Credentials;
- c. Relevant Work Experiences;
- d. Personal Character Records in the barangay;
- e. Results of Social Case Study; and
- f. Other parameters deemed applicable to the subject matter

The TWG shall devise a monitoring and evaluation system of the victims/surrenderrees in accordance to existing laws and applicable directives of concerned national agencies;

The TWG shall submit regular Progress and Terminal Reports to the Municipal Mayor.

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**ARTICLE IV
AWARDS AND INCENTIVES**

The municipal government shall initiate annual assessment to barangays official and individuals on the following to be awarded during the Annual Damili Festival or any occasion appropriate thereto while corresponding incentives shall be likewise provided;

SECTION 8.7. Search for the Best Performing BADAC Healing Time Implementer – there shall be an annual search for the best performing BADAC Healing Time Implementer. The criteria shall be formulated by the Healing Time Technical Working Group (TWG).

SECTION 8.8. Search for the Most Supportive Punong Barangay on Healing Time Implementation – there shall be an annual search for the Most Supportive Punong Barangay on Healing Time Implementation. The criteria shall be formulated by the Healing Time Technical Working Group (TWG).

**ARTICLE V
FINAL PROVISIONS**

SECTION 8.9. Appropriations. To effectively implement this ordinance, a “Healing Time” Fund incorporated in the Peace and Order Council (POC) Fund amounting to Five Hundred Thousand Pesos (P500,000.00) shall be appropriated annually to finance the programs, projects and activities for the PWUDs and illegal drug surrenderers.

SECTION 9. Separability Clause. If for any reason any section or provision of this ordinance, or any portion thereof, or the application of such section, provision or portion thereof to any person, group or circumstances is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected by such declaration and shall remain in force and effect.

SECTION 10. Repealing Clause. All ordinances, local issuance or rules inconsistent with the provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 11. Effectivity Clause. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval.


