“MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2020-26

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 AND SECTION 2 OF MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2020-20 ALSO KNOWN AS “AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING FEES IN THE CONDUCT OF RAPID ANTI-BODY TEST AT THE RURAL HEALTH UNIT (RHU)”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Coping up with the adverse effects of COVID-19 now is a worldwide concern, cases continue to rise and vaccine still to be discovered or invented turning economies to stumble, and on the world on the verge of economic recession. People are becoming hungry, many lost their jobs and what haunts them most is the possibility of catching the virus, getting infected that could spread it to others, including their own family members.

Transmission of the disease became so rapid, the health sector apparently unprepared in responding intelligently as there remains no available vaccine, limited protective equipment, and hospitals running out of spaces to infected patients. Scarcity of testing kits was one primary cause as the health workers were incapable of detecting and identifying the patients.

Towards this end, the Local Government Unit of san Nicolas endeavors to purchase Rapid Test Kits to possibly identify those infected patients so as to enable the RHU to isolate them, provide treatment and mitigate the transmission. The result of Rapid Anti-Body Test too, is now a requirement to returning workers in their work stations, increasing the demand.

Thus, the need to enact an ordinance to authorize the collection of laboratory fees which would be lower from other medical institutions so that in a way, those needing the test would be helped.

WHEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Sangguniang Bayan in session duly assembled the following:

SECTION 1. Section 1 and Section 2 of Municipal Ordinance No. 2020-20, provides that:

“SECTION 1. Title. This ordinance shall be known as “Fee for Rapid Anti-Body Test Ordinance of the Municipality of San Nicolas, Ilocos Norte”.

SECTION 2. Prescribed Fees in the Conduct of Rapid Anti-Body Test at the Rural Health Unit (RHU).

- a. There shall be imposed fees in the conduct of Rapid Anti-Body Test in the amount of One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00).*
- b. Patients bringing with them their Rapid Test kits shall be required to pay the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Pesos (P250.00) for laboratory paraphernalias and service fee.*

The aforesaid respective fee/s shall be paid to the Municipal Treasurer’s Office before the health, laboratory or related service is made and result of examination thereof is issued.”

SECTION 2. Section 1 and Section 2 of Municipal Ordinance No. 2020-20 is hereby amended to, to wit:

“SECTION 1. Title. This ordinance shall be known as “Fee for Rapid Diagnostic Test Ordinance of the Municipality of San Nicolas, Ilocos Norte”.

SECTION 2. Prescribed Fees in the Conduct of Rapid Diagnostic Test at the Rural Health Unit (RHU).

- a. There shall be imposed fees in the conduct of Rapid Anti-Body Test in the amount of One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00);*
- b. There shall be imposed fees in the conduct of Rapid Antigen Test in the amount of One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00);*
- c. Patients bringing with them their Rapid Test kits shall be required to pay the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Pesos (P250.00) for laboratory paraphernalias and service fee.*

The aforesaid respective fee/s shall be paid to the Municipal Treasurer’s Office before the health, laboratory or related service is made and result of examination thereof is issued.”

SECTION 3. Repealing Clause. - All previous issuances, ordinance, rules and regulations, provisions or parts thereof, which are inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 4. Separability Clause. - If for any reason, any section of this Ordinance is declared illegal or unconstitutional, other sections hereof which are not affected shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 5. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect upon approval.
