“RESOLUTION NO. 2023-270

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING AND APPROVING THE LOCAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT FUND INVESTMENT PLAN (LDRRMFIP) OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF SAN NICOLAS, ILOCOS NORTE FOR THE YEAR 2024 AS EMBODIED IN THE MUNICIPAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COUNCIL (MDRRMC) RESOLUTION NO. 2023-08.

WHEREAS, the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (MDRRMC) has prioritized the programs, projects and activities geared towards a safer and more secure San Nicoleño community to be included in the Annual Investment Program for Calendar Year 2024;

WHEREAS, these projects, programs and activities have been classified according to the four (4) Thematic Areas of Disaster Risk Reduction and Management namely: (1) Disaster Prevention and Mitigation, (2) Disaster Preparedness, (3) Disaster Response, and (4) Disaster Rehabilitation and Recovery;

WHEREAS, the municipality's Five (5%) Percent Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund (LDRRMF) amounts to Twelve Million Seven Hundred Seventy Eight Thousand Three Hundred Seventy-Nine and 50/100 Pesos (P12,778,379.50);

WHEREAS, the 30% of the LDRRMF has been assigned as the Quick Response Fund amounting to Three Million Eight Hundred Thirty-Three Thousand Five Hundred Thirteen and 86/100 Pesos (P3,833,513.86) which can only be used in the event of a state of calamity;

WHEREAS, the remaining 70% of the LDRRMF amounting to Eight Million Nine Hundred Forty-Four Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty-Five and 64/100 Pesos (P8,944,865.64) can be used for disaster prevention and mitigation, preparedness, response and rehabilitation and recovery;

WHEREAS, the following are the programs, projects and activities to which the 5% LDRRM Fund will be expended:

2. Assessment of roads, bridges, rivers, creeks, canals and irrigation systems	20,000.00

4. Provision of insurance to government buildings and facilities	500,000.00
5. Conduct of tree growing and urban/rural space greening and Regreening activities	150,000.00
6. Updating of DRRM, Contingency and other DRR-CCA Enhanced Plans	100,000.00

8. Construction of Small Farm Reservoir	200,000.00
9. Cultivation of drought/water resistant crops	100,000.00

RESOLVED FURTHER to transcribe copies of this resolution and furnish same to all concerned, for their information and guidance.


On motion of Member Juanito P. Ulep, Jr., duly seconded, foregoing resolution was unanimously approved.
